***Südost-Forschungen*** is one of the oldest periodical publications for the history of Southeastern Europe. Its first volume appeared in 1936 and since then, it has become one of the leading outlets for German but also international research on the history of Southeastern Europe. Next year, *Südost-Forschungen* plans to switch from a yearbook to two issues per year.

*Südost-Forschungen* subscribes to a broad and interdisciplinary view of history, publishing on subjects ranging from political questions to the history of culture, language and arts, economic and social history, historical geography and the history of religion. The journal is committed to cover the history of the region from the Byzantine era to contemporary history. Part of the journal's mission is to present research from the region to an international audience and to serve as a platform for excellent regional scholarship. The extensive reviews section, in which many works in the languages of the region are discussed, also testifies to that objective.

For the upcoming issues, *Südost-Forschungen* is inviting contributions from all fields of the history of Southeastern Europe. After screening by the editors, manuscripts undergo a double-blind review with two reviews. Manuscripts can be submitted continuously. We accept manuscripts in German and English. While most research articles are stand alone papers, the journal also invites submissions for symposia, which usually consist of a selection of three to four research articles linked by an overarching theme.

The maximum length of contributions is 12,000 words (including footnotes). Apart from research articles, the journal accepts extensive review articles and reflections on current research trends and the historiography of the region (in its section "From Southeast European Studies"). The journal occasionally publishes edited sources plus commentary.
